

Winter Wonderland Opens At Soldier Field Dec. 7

Winter Wonderland, Chicago's own version of St. Moritz or Sun Valley, opens on or about Dec. 7 in Soldier Field. The huge project brings skiing and tobogganing for public participation right into the heart of Chicago.

The lake front stadium has been converted into a delightful winter sports mecca. Conceived by Oscar Brotman, a Chicago attorney of vivid imagination, and developed into a reality by him and his associates, Winter Wonderland is dedicated solely to the public.

The invention of a compressor capable of making real snow has made possible this vast undertaking. Twelve of these compressors, each capable of turning out three tons a minute, are being utilized at Soldier Field.

Two ski slopes, one down the

seats at the southwest end of the stadium and the other near the northwest end, have been erected. Two electric tow ropes, operating off 20 horsepower motors, will bring the skiers to the top of the stadium for the start of their run.

Four 1200-foot toboggan runs descend down the seats from the top of the southeast end. The participants may bring their own skis or toboggans, or rent them at the shop opened on the premises. Warmup rooms, hay rides and sleigh rides also will be available.

Four certified control United States Ski association instructors will be available for lessons. They are Mr. and Mrs. Don Ackerly of Lake Geneva, Buddy Green of Chicago and Helmut Teichner of Switzerland.

Admission to Winter Wonderland and use of its facilities will be a nominal fee. The schedule calls for sessions 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 11 p.m. on weekdays. On Saturdays, Sundays and holidays and during the Christmas holiday season, open as follows: 9 a.m. to noon, 1 p.m. to 6 p.m., and 7 p.m. to 11 p.m.
