

## Private Indiana Country Club Open To Public

ANGOLA, Ind. — Under a new program announced Thursday, Tamarack Mountain Country club, located three and a half miles north of here off U.S. highway 27, is being opened to the general public. Previously, the two-year-old winter resort had been a private club open only to members and guests. Club President Daniel S. Bakstad of Angola, said the move was aimed at developing skiing, virtually a new sport in Indiana.

Tamarack's ski school director, Hugo Bohm, an Austria native, is a veteran of the United States army ski patrol and 1954 winner of the giant military slalom in Austria.

Tamarack Mountain club has Indiana's only double chair lift, as well as four rope tows and a poma lift. There is a 2,700 foot slope on the 400 acre tract. The peak of Tamarack mountain is the highest point in Indiana, affording a panoramic view of three states.
