

# New Golf Links Opening in Spring

CEDAR FALLS — By June 1, the new Beaver Hills Country Club should be fully operative.

At that time, members expect to play on a newly built nine-hole golf course.

The club's new \$75,000 clubhouse is expected to be completed by April 1. Construction

of the clubhouse started in early November and has been progressing on schedule, according to Robert W. Voorhees, president.

## Two-Story Structure

The clubhouse will be a two-story, 50 by 50-foot structure with brick exterior.

General contractor is Roy

Avis Construction Co., Waterloo. The plumbing and air-conditioning contract was awarded to Gilbertville Plumbing and Heating and the electric contract went to Fagan Electric of Cedar Falls.

The club owns 148 acres as club grounds. Of that, 73 acres are taken up by the golf course. The total also includes about 50

home sites. The club has options on an additional 55 acres.

The club which was formally founded in October of 1963, now has 263 memberships.

## Old Club Dissolves

It became the second such Cedar Falls organization until the Washington Park Country Club voted to dissolve effective Dec. 15 and turn its assets over to the new club.

Assets to be taken over by the new club have been estimated at about \$5,000 in inventories and money in the bank.

The board of directors of the club has entered a \$1 a year lease with the newly-formed Beaver Hills Ski Association for a ski slope near the clubhouse.

Members of the association have cleared the slope of weeds, brush and trees to use it as a ski area.
