# Swim Victory

...a power-laden swimming in the seventh annual Big Ten... notice that it won't easily... its Big Ten title.

Led by their nucleus of world of American record holders—bet Jastrzemski, Alan Somera, the Troy, Tom Stock and Fred Jickles—the Hoosiers took first eight of the 11 events for a total of 103 points.

Stickles, sophomore Cary Trewan and Jastrzemski combined to set one meet record in limiting the 500-yard individual relay.

**THE SURPRISE** of the day, however, was Michigan State, which set meet records in two events the 200 and 400-yard freestyle relays, and prevented Hoosier sweep of the swimming events.

Defending NCAA champion Michigan, Indiana's strongest rival in the Big Ten, was nearly shut out on first place in its own pool but salvaged a lone first in the diving.

In team scoring Michigan State was second with 74 and Michigan was third with 70. Michigan finished fourth with 27 and Wayne State fifth with 12.

## Free Press Ski School Sites

**HERE'S THE WAY** to the Free Press Learn-to-Ski School. The bottom line of the map represents Eight Mile Rd. For Mt. Brighton, go to the end of the Grand River expressway west of Brighton and turn left on Old Grand River. Go back approximately one-quarter of a mile to Chalis Rd. and turn right at the Mt. Brighton sign. Summit is 13 miles north of the US-16 and US-23 interchange. Turn right at Hogan Rd. exit and follow the Summit signs to Foley Rd. Or, take M-39 across to Fenton Rd. and north on Fenton Rd. to Foley Rd. Granview is four miles north of Fenton on Fenton Rd. Mt. Holly is 18 miles north of Pontiac on US-10 (Woodward) and is on the west side of the road. Christie and Grampian are off M-24. For Grampian, turn right onto Lakeville Rd., which runs through Oxford and it is just outside the Oxford city limits. Christie is west of M-24. Turn off on Davison Lake Rd. Dryden is 1 1/2 miles west of M-150 (Rochester Rd.) on Hough Rd.

...body's youngsters asked him to take them skiing several winters ago.

**THE PLACE** was so crowded that there wasn't much room for the youngsters to ski," said Mrs. Peabody. "So Stan thought that if there were that many people interested in skiing that we would clear some of our area and go into business."

The Peabody's are busy from spring through fall with their orchards. They have 140 acres of their 200-acre farm in orchards and there are raspberries, too. In the fall they also operate a cider mill.

And then there are the teenage dances which are held in their ski lodge throughout the year. Some 500 to 700 youngsters turn out for the dances.

**WE CATER** to the young people," Mrs. Peabody said.

And the young people cater to them. The Peabody's have six children of their own and about 25 neighborhood youngsters also pitch in to help.

The Peabody children all are assigned jobs whether it's the skiing season or summer.

But they also find time for skiing. Ann Louise, the oldest at 19, is on the ski team at Flint Junior College.

Cissy, 18, is a freshman at the University of Wyoming and gets in some skiing out west.

Stan, 17, is an exchange student this year. He's attending the 11th grade in Arezzo, Italy.

At home are Candy, 14, a ninth grader at Lake Fenton Community School, Mari-Toni, 12, and Dany-Lo, 9.

**THE HEAD** of Granview's ski school is Jack Lewis, 55-year-old Redford High School English and speed-reading instructor. Lewis is one of the best-known skiers in the state.

Granview is aimed primarily at the beginning and intermediate skier. The area has six rope tows and the Peabody's plan to enlarge the area and develop a larger hill next season.

Granview and the six other Ski School sites—Summit, Mt. Brighton, Mt. Holly, Dryden, Mt. Christie and Grampian—will welcome the first group of Free Press skiers Monday beginning at 7 p.m.

Some 4,000 are enrolled in the first three-week school and this is the last chance to enroll in the second three-week segment which begins Jan. 29 for those who want to attend Monday nights and Jan. 30 for those who wish to attend Tuesday nights.
