Ski Association Going Strong at Northport

The Northport Ski Association Ski Association started in 1963 as a joint venture of Northport and Leland citizens who were interested in promoting a winter recreation area at reasonable family rates.

The original board of directors were Anthony J. Brendel, Dwight Schroeder, M.D., Bob Buehrcr, John Travis, Bruce Smith, Jack Charter, Glen White, John Simpson. Robert Spinniken, George Grosvenor, Stanley Ball, Ray Alpers and Gayles Dame.

The present site was rented from Glenn Braman and the rope tow was powered by a tractor at the top of the hill. AH the work on the hill was done on a strictly volunteer basis.

The Leelanau Township Foundation supplied the necessary funds to purchase new rope which was an expensive item. Lights were soon included for night-skiing.

By 1968, the Leland group started ts own ski area at Stanley Ball's place and the board of directors changed to Donald J. Dalzell, George Fredrickson, George Anderson. Bob Buehrer, Gerry Dechow, Fred Charter, Doris Schroeder, Jack Larimore and Ed Bowen. Though the long, hard efforts of George Fredrickson, Bob Buehrer, Don Dalzell and the Leelanau Township Foundation, the decision was made to buy the hill from Mr. Braman Then George Fredrickson, David Allen, the Township supervisor, worked on a federal grant through which the property would revert to |money available would be utilized bythe township but the present site and the Northport Ski Association, now
