

Snow Aids Skiing Here

Petoskey's ski runs out on the Fettig farm hills are in splendid condition today, according to Frederick Curtis of the Petoskey Ski Club. A visit to the hills disclosed that the fresh snow had covered the slides in good shape and that one of the best weekends of the early winter season is in prospect.

The ski hills are free to the public at all times. The only place where a charge is made is for the ski tow on one of the hills. The tow is in operation only a part of the time, but while it is in operation, the one hill it occupies is reserved for the persons who pay for the tow privilege. All of the other hills are entirely free. Visitors from other parts of the state are invited to use the hills at any time.

With the coming of sufficient snow for this sport a schedule of hours when the hills will be lighted, and a schedule of hill classes for both adult and youth instruction will be set up. There will be special instruction for high school students wishing to learn in order to participate in the school ski activities. The ski committee hopes to have this schedule ready by Monday, Mr. Curtis said today.

The ski hills have been cleared of obstructions and now form the finest place in Northern Michigan for both beginners and experienced ski fans. They are located a short way out of the city on East Mitchell street.
