

# Kalkaska Will Have Work Bee

KALKASKA, Dec. 8—A work bee will be staged Saturday and Sunday to construct a new road into Lake Valley Resort in Bear Lake township, 12 miles east of Kalkaska on M-72.

Easements for building a road along section lines into the new winter sports development were obtained Tuesday.

Kalkaska community leaders have expressed a desire to assist in this phase of the project in order to assure its completion in time for the resort's first season, according to Ed Plummer, Chamber of Commerce president.

Lunch will be served the volunteer workers who take part in the

project Saturday and Sunday, and President Joe Newman of the resort said complimentary passes will be issued to volunteers for use of ski runs and toboggan runs during the season.

The winter sports development is being built on Black Lake on a 760-acre tract of property. It will offer six ski slopes with two tows, toboggan runs and a skating rink, and will have a big lodge.

Opening of Lake Valley Resort is set for December 18.
