Apartments Opened in 1969

Ramblewood's recreational facilities began to develop when the first apartment building was opened Oct. 1, 1969. On that day 20,000 trout from private hatchery cources were planted in the property to the north. Since then many trout, and at least one coho salmon, have been caught by apartment residents.

While the ski area is the latest development, Ramblewood residents have been using their new recreational building, Ramblewilde, the last several weeks. The structure houses an indoor heated pool, showers, locker rooms, sauna baths, exercise rooms and pool tables, in addition to a party bar, dining and games area and a large lounge.
