

Learn-to-Ski Program Has Mt. Holly Sessions

The Flint Recreation and Park Board has expanded its free program of ski instruction to include sessions at Mt. Holly.

Mort Graddis, owner and manager of the Mt. Holly ski area, has pledged his cooperation with the program, which gets underway with a meeting Thursday night at Swartz Creek golf course clubhouse.

Jim Bruce of the Recreation and Park Board office says three Thursday nights tentatively have been reserved for free lessons at Mt. Holly. The sessions are from 7 to 9 and will be handled by certified Central United States Ski Association instructors.

There will be 12 per one-hour class for the beginners. The classes will be conducted in the area that includes a 15 per cent slope and a two mile an hour beginners tow. After the free lesson, skiers may ski in the area for a reduced fee of \$1.

Bruce said that daytime classes will be arranged and a second series of night classes scheduled if there is enough interest. He also said that final arrangements will be made Thursday night at

the 7 o'clock meeting at the Swartz clubhouse.

Already announced are a series of three free lessons at the Swartz Creek ski area on Monday through Thursday nights as soon as the weather permits. These lessons will be handled by qualified instructors from the Flint Ski Club.

In addition to making final class arrangements, the Thursday night meeting at Swartz offers a demonstration of ski clothing, explanation of fundamentals, a movie and a question and answer session.

Now all the program needs is some snow.
