

St. Cloud Units To Appear at Wonderland

With final plans for the big Winter Wonderland snow carnival at Little Falls completed, indications are that St. Cloud will be well represented during the three days of the third annual festival.

Among the St. Cloud units scheduled to appear are the St. Cloud Figure Skating club, which will present a review at the Blue Mirror skating rink Sunday afternoon; the Claudettes Ice Review, which is made up of members of the club, will participate, under the direction of Miss Lillian Knettel; the Orpheus club; Mel-o-Tones and other local talent which will appear in a contest.

The talent show tonight will have the following persons from St. Cloud appearing: Don Mehr, Margaret Ann Appert and Joan Rieder.

Also participating, from St. Cloud, will be E. L. Stockinger, who will act as master of ceremonies at the Saturday night festivities, and Paul Mulready, who will appear as emcee for the Sunday evening variety show.

In addition to the portions of the show previously mentioned, activities will include the appearance of Clellan Card, Twin Cities radio man who will act as master of ceremonies for the talent program tonight. Guest appearances will be made by the Winterettes of Sartell, Wonderland Duet of Little Falls, and Jean Lindell, Winter Wonderland queen.

Nine Contestants Entered

Queen Lindell will crown the new queen at a coronation ball to be held Saturday night. Nine contestants from Central Minnesota will vie for the queen's crown. Dance music at the ball will be furnished by the Moon Misters of St. John's university.

It also has been announced that toboggan and ski pulls will be operating at Winter Wonderland Sunday afternoon.

The St. Cloud figure skaters will perform at 3 p.m. Sunday.

Heater Kills 2 At Alexandria

Alexandria (AP)—A small gas heater used in a sick room brought death Wednesday to two Alexandria women, one of them on a mercy visit.

The victims were Mrs. Capitola Mills, about 55, who was using the heater in her bedroom while she was ill, and Mrs. George Olson, about 55, a neighbor. Mrs. Olson had gone to the home to see if she could help her neighbor.

The bodies were found by Mrs. Olson's husband. Mrs. Olson was still in the chair she had drawn to the bedside of Mrs. Mills. At her feet were Mrs. Mills' two cats—unconscious. They died a few minutes later.

Coroner Emil Gahlon said the heater exhausted the oxygen in the room and asphyxiated the women. He ruled their deaths as accidental.
