Ski Mishap Kills Don Newland, 42

Donald A. Newland, 42, Dover architect and skiing enthusiast, was killed early yesterday afternoon on a ski trail at White-face Mountain near Saranac Lake, N.Y.

Newland, who was visiting the Adirondack ski resort with his wife, was participating in a "snowflake" (non-competitive) race down Northway Trail when he apparently lost control of his skis and veered into the bordering woods.

Observers said his head struck a tree stump when he fell over the tips of his skis.

Essex County coroner ruled death was instantaneous, resulting from a compound skull fracture.

The accident occurred 200 yards from the main lodge of the Whiteface Mountain ski area.

Born in Dover, Newland was a son of Lawrence A. Newland of 320 W. 12th st. His mother is deceased. His father reportedly is on vacation in the South.

A Dover High alumnus, he was graduated from Ohio State University in 1952 with a degree in architecture.

His widow is the former Marian Lintner of Columbus and he had 2 children, Robert, a Dover High junior, and Patricia Ann, a 5th grader at South Eiementary. Also surviving is a brother, Dr. Harry Newland of Westerville.

He was a member of the Ohio Institute of Architects and had his business office at 215 Walnut st. A ski supply store, the Ski Shoppe, owned by his wife, is located in the same building.

Newland was instrumental in establishing Hidden Valley Golf Course and was operator of Hidden Valley Ski Club.

Funeral arrangements are pending at Toland-Herzig Funeral Home.
