

Viking Valley To Operate Minus Jump

Whitehall, Wis.—(Special)— The ski jump scaffold which was blown down in two windstorms last year will not be rebuilt at Viking Valley. The decision was made at a meeting Friday of the directors of Winter Sports, Inc.

The organization will continue to maintain Viking Valley as a ski area and the tow will be operated this winter.

Norman Anderson and John O.

Gilbertson were re-elected directors for three years of Winter Sports, Inc., at its annual meeting held at the Legion rooms Friday evening. Holdover directors are Hiram Hegge, E. L. Gilbertson, Dr. N. S. Simons and Kenneth Swenson. William Amundson was elected to fill the unexpired term of Roy Huitfeldt, who moved to Fond du Lac.

The organization voted to sell the north 18 acres of the property known as Viking Valley to Berger Lund. The area includes the residence now occupied by Mr. Lund and land not suitable for skiing.
