

Palisades Park to Enlarge ? ?

A 122-acre farm, situated in the heart of the north end of the Palisades State Park, north of Savanna, Illinois, has been sold to The Illinois Building Authority, an independent purchasing agent that acquires property for the Department of Conservation for the State of Illinois. The selling price of the farm was \$80,000, according to the warranty deed, dated August 14, 1968, on file in the Carroll County Courthouse. The acreage was formerly owned by Theodore R. Haller, of Savanna, and had been the home of the Savanna Valley ski resort for the past few years, a development of Mr. Haller's. Mr. Haller recently sold all of his ski equipment to the Clinton

Park Board, Clinton, Iowa.

The Review Publications contacted various officials of the Department of Conservation, Springfield, Illinois, late Tuesday and was informed that verification of future plans for the development and use of the farm would not be available until the end of this week when department officials would re-

turn to their Springfield offices. However, unofficially, we were informed that the acreage would undoubtedly become a part of the Palisades State Park in the near future.

Mr. Haller stated Tuesday afternoon that he plans to move to property that he owns in Jo Daviess County within the next two months.
