

Sartell to Dedicate New 'Winter Haven'

SARTELL, Minn., (P)—A three-day program dedicating central Minnesotas new Winter Haven playground at Sartell opens today with a luncheon for 15 area queen candidates.

The playground project was begun last September by Rev. Edward Ramacher, pastor of St. Francis Catholic church in Sartell. Before coming to Sartell he founded Winter Wonderland in Little Falls.

Governor Youngdahl will officially open the playground at 2 p.m. tomorrow when he raises an American flag in front of Sunset lodge.

The lodge and a professional-size skating rink are the results of community effort by Sartell citizens. President of the non-profit corporation in charge of the project is John Shank, Jr.

The queen of Winter Haven will be crowned tonight during a two-hour variety show in Sunset lodge.
