

# Ski slopes provided in state

In spite of its table-top surface, North Dakota does provide six areas for skiing during the winter season.

The longest run is at Fort Ransom, with a 2,640-foot run with a vertical rise of 300 feet. The site has three rope tows. Other ski areas are:

Rolla View, Rolla, 1,200-ft. run, 140-ft. rise and three rope tows.

Sky-Line, Devils Lake, 1,500-ft. run, 190-ft. rise and one rope tows.

Villa Vista, Arvilla, 900-ft. slope, 100-ft. rise and four rope tows.

Bottineau Winter Park, 1,300-

ft. slope, 250-ft. rise and three rope tows and a T-bar.

Nor-Ski Slopes, Edinburg, 900-ft. slope, 120-ft. rise and three rope tows.
