

Local Building Firm Incorporates

Articles of incorporation for four North Dakota concerns, including a winter sports resort, have been filed with the secretary of State.

The Midwestern Construction Co., of Mandan is capitalized at \$25,000, to engage in construction and related activities. Its directors are Leo J. Boehm and E. N. Paul of Mandan and R. M. Hart of Bismarck.

The Knob Hill Ski Area of Valley City is capitalized at \$25,000, to own and operate a ski tow, slalom ski course, toboggan slide, ski jump and ski chalet.

Its directors are Gordon and Mary Gray of Valley City and Janette Gray of Wilton.

The College Hill Development Assn., of Williston was formed as a non-profit organization "to foster and promote the vocational and higher education interests of the people of Divide, McKenzie and Williams counties."

It has a board of 21 directors, including Harry E. Polk, publisher of the Williston Herald.

Another non-profit group, the Tokio Indian Mission of Tokio, N. D., was formed to provide a home for delinquent minor girls. Its trustees are Dorothy Engstrand and Violet Van Hellen of Tokio and Ethel M. Haas of Cando.
