# Seven Grand Forks Firms Incorporated

Seven Grand Forks firms were incorporated during the 30 days ended Dec. 10, Secretary of State Ben Meier reported from Bismarck.

Two other northeastern North Dakota business concerns also filed articles of incorporation during the period. The new corporations, with their business purposes, incorporators and authorized capital, included:

— Air Dakota Inc., Grand Forks; deal in airplanes, etc.; Harry E. Senski, Jerome N. Dunlevy Jr., and James B. Carlson; \$25,000. Dunlevy said the three incorporators jointly own an airplane and the corporation was formed for that purpose only.

— United Research Inc., Grand Forks; soil testing and research for agricultural and other purposes; Carlton G. Nelson, Jerome J. Mack and John H. Moosbrugger; \$50,000. Nelson said the three incorporators represented a group of Grand Forks and Minneapolis men who are starting the new business.

— Kitten Radio Inc., Grand Forks; construct and operate radio stations; Justin Hoberg, Robert Hansen, Wayne Lockhart, Douglas Tegtmeier and Terrence Harrington; \$50,000. Hoberg, president of KNOX Inc. here, said the new corporation is a subsidiary of KNOX Inc. to operate Radio Station KTYN, Minot, and possible future acquisitions.

— Nor-Ski-Slopes Inc., Grand Forks; operate ski hills, etc.; Carlton G. Nelson, Jerome J. Mack and John H. Moosbrugger; \$50,000. Nelson said the incorporators represent a group of Hoople, N.D., men developing a ski resort in that area.

— Grand Forks Psychiatric Institute P.C., Grand Forks, professional services of medicine and surgery; Blaine E. McLaughlin; \$100,000.

— Outdoor Sports Inc., Grand

Forks; retail and wholesale sales and service; Don Hagen, Kenneth L. Bina and Clinton Rodningen Jr., \$25,000.

— State-Wide Agency Inc., New Rockford; general insurance and real estate; Erlin K. Rolfson, Charles Richter, Mervin Bjornson, Kenneth G. Anderson, James Lill, Gerald Forde, Daniel Rimmereid, Darris Bittner and Norman Anderson; \$100,000.

— Bib Corp., Petersburg; on- and off-sale liquor and food business; Robert H. Brown, James C. Bang and Duane A. Indergaard; \$25,000.
