

Ft. William Club Makes Additions

Ontario's most westerly club at Kenora continues to promote ski weekends from nearby Manitoba.

Fort William Ski Club, on top of the Lakehead's landmark, Mount McKay, has completed a new intermediate run over 7,000 feet long to be serviced by a T-bar or Poma lift. The double chairlift and snowmaking equipment are in operation.

Loch Lomond at Fort William has added a new T-bar to its uphill facilities, widened the intermediate and advanced slopes and increased lodge facilities.

Little Norway, 12 miles south of Fort William, has completed a program of widening all runs, especially a fine, long beginner's slope.

On Mount Baldy, Port Arthur Ski Club now has its double chairlift ready.
