To all those interested in skiing the following is for your information:

Trying to keep pace with the growing popularity of the sport, Ontario has been active the last few months enlarging its ski facilities. Here are some of the latest developments . . . Adjacent to Beaver Valley in the Kimberly area in a new ski resort called the Talisman. The promoters expect to have installed by this season two double-chair lifts and two rope tows. Also planned, but not for this year, is a motel-lodge . . . Another new ski area is scheduled for development in the same district, but whether it will be in operation this season is still questionable . . . Blue Mountain ski area has added a T-bar lift and extended its trails to tie together remote slopes . . . Alpine Ski Club at Collingwood has added a Pomalift . . . Georgian Peaks will open the season with a coffee shop at the top of its chair lift . . . A heated outdoor swimming pool, the only one of its kind for hundreds of miles around, is the pride of Bay Motor Hotel at Owen Sound. The pool adjacent to the ski area, also offers a Finnish steam bath. Under construction are dormitories at the slopes . . . The Lakehead area has a new ski club, Little Norway Ski Resort, at Fort William. Plans include a major lift, but it may not be ready for this season . . . In Muskoka, the Tally-Ho Lodge and the Britannia Hotel have both added Pomalifts . . . A new ski area is in the works at Ox-

Tongue Lake, with two Pomalifts planned, but again it may not be completed for this winter . . . Rainbow Ridge at Hidden Valley has added a couple of rope tows for novices.

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Belleville, Trenton, Napanee, Picton and other Bay of Quinte area ski enthusiasts are happy. A new skiing and winter sports centre has been developed by the Mountain View Ski Club, Belleville, just south of Mountain View Airport, a quarter mile east of Highway 14 between Belleville and Picton. The new winter recreation centre, laid out on a broad escarpment affording a beautiful panorama of the Bay of Quinte, provides a variety of interests for family pleasure. Facilities include four or five different slopes of varying grades and speeds for beginners to experienced skiers, a heated Chalet or Club House for snacks, coffee and warming up, and a separate protected slope for children and non-skiers for sledding or tobogganing. Services include an electrically operated tow, ski instruction and ski patrols.

From January 5 through March 8, the Canadian National Railway will again operate special ski trains to Stayner, Collingwood and Craighleith. In a package deal, the railway offers round trip tickets, transfer between Collingwood and Georgian Peaks Ski Resort, and tickets to all ski lifts. The all-inclusive rate is \$7.75 for adults and \$5.90 for children between the ages of 5 and 12.

The Sunday "Ski Specials" will leave Toronto Union Station at 8 a.m. with stops at Parkdale and St. Clair stations, arriving at Georgian Peaks Ski Resort at 10:45 a.m. Departure time from Georgian Peaks Resort will be 5 p.m., and arrival at Toronto Union Station, 7:55 p.m.
