

13 Public Ski Resorts In Grey, Bruce Counties Provide Great Variety

The 13 public ski resorts in Grey and Bruce counties offer a wide variety of skiing opportunities. The resorts are listed below with their respective features and locations.

1. KINCARDINE SKI CLUB
Located about 1 1/2 miles north east of Kincardine. One 400-foot rope tow, vertical rise 100 feet. Ingest run, 500 feet. One open slope, two trails. Open weekends and Wednesday afternoons. Week-end rental, lift ticket \$2 per day, \$1 per half day for children.

2. FAISLEY SKI CLUB
Located in south-western outskirts of Paisley. Rope tow, open slope about 500 feet; ski school director, Claude Elmslie.

3. WALKERTON SKI DEVELOPMENTS LTD.
Located on northwestern outskirts of Walkerton. 3 Zavoran-type lifts, two in 900 foot tandem, one 300 foot on beginner hill; longest run 1,200 feet; 10 runs; open Wednesday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday with night skiing Wednesday, Friday and Saturday; lift ticket \$4, \$2.50, night \$2; chain and ski shop with rentals.

4. MINTO GLEN
Located about seven miles northwest of Mount Forest. Rope tow, vertical rise about 25 feet; chair.

5. HARRISON PARK
Located in Harrison Park in Owen Sound. One rope tow, vertical rise 100 ft.; 450 ft. slope; 2 miles cross-country trails; open Saturday and Sunday afternoons and holidays if there are enough skiers; night skiing every night but tow is not operating.

6. BAY SKI VILLAGE
Located about two miles south east of Chatsworth. 2 T-bars, 4 open chairs, 235 foot vertical rise; longest slope 2,400 feet; open daily, night skiing; snow-making machinery; lift ticket \$5 during week, \$4 on week-ends; ski school directors, Bill and Jim Georgian; chain and ski shop and rentals.

7. OLD SMOKEY
Located about two miles north of Kimberley. 1 T-bar, 1 rope tow, vertical rise 285 feet; longest slope 230 feet; 4 open slopes; one weekend; lift ticket \$4; ski school director, Zoltan Barogh; ski shop.

8. TALKMAN
Located about one mile north of Kimberley. 3 double chairlifts, 1 T-bar, 1 rope, 5 slopes; longest slope 450 feet; open daily, meal nights, lift ticket \$4 on weekend, \$4.50 week-ends; ski school director, Lorna McFadden; snow-making; chain and ski shop and rentals.

9. BEAVER VALLEY SKI RESORTS LTD.
Located about one mile south west of Kimberley. 2 T-bars, 1 T-bar, 4 ropes, 8 open slopes, 6 trails; vertical rise 500 feet; longest slope 450 feet; open Wednesday, Friday, week-ends; night skiing Friday and Saturday.

10. GEORGIAN PEAKS
Located about five miles east of Thornbury. 1 double chairlift, 1 T-bar, 1 poma, 1 rope, 11 slopes, 5 trails; vertical rise 810 feet; longest slope 1,200 feet; open daily; lift ticket \$4 week-days, \$5 week-ends; ski school, Director, Hans Wuland; snow-making; ski shop, chairlift.

11. CRAIGLEITH WINTER PARK
Located about five miles west of Collingwood. A semi-private area open to about 200 visitors per day or until partially crowded. 3 T-bars, 11 slopes, 5 trails; trail 3,000 feet; lift ticket \$3; ski school director, Ron Healey; chairlift and ski shop.

12. BLUE MOUNTAIN WINTER PARK
Located about 4 miles west of Collingwood. 2 double chairlifts, 3 T-bars, 4 pomas, 4 ropes, 12 slopes, 14 trails; vertical rise 800 feet; longest slope 1,000 feet; ski school director, Jean Guy Brunel; snow-making, chairlift, ski shop; lift tickets \$4, week-days, \$5 week-ends.

13. ALPINE
Located about five miles west of Collingwood. 2 T-bars, 3 rope tows, vertical rise 700 feet; longest trail, 3,500 feet; open week-ends and holidays.

year there is a new parking lot which adds a third to the old 500 car space. But the resort still takes only a limited number of skiers. Most of the skiing is on trails and some narrow slopes which drop in the intermediate and expert range.

Still on the same hill range and set far away from Collingwood the Alpine Ski Resort has expanded this year. The main T-bar in the top of the hills has been supplemented by a 1,300 foot long model that climbs halfway up the slopes to service five new trails out through the trees. Its sheltered location gives it some of the latest spring skiing in this part of the province.

Happy Valley Ski Resort, close to the town of Walkerton, is going into its second year with few changes. Plans call for a T-bar, to supplement the three Bavarian lifts within the next year or two. The Bavarian lifts, tandem with wooden handles run in tandem to put skiers at the top of the hills several days a week. At the bottom there is an eatery and bar. Plans for incorporating ski shops, rentals and a cafeteria.

To the south, near Harrison, the Minto Glen ski area has a new 1,100 foot long rope tow this year and the main run has been widened. Bay in operation are three more close to home areas near Paisley, Kin-

carline and in Harrison Park in Owen Sound. Although they are short and only offer rope tows these ski hills are ideal for the beginner who would be lost on a big hill. Another advantage is the fact they are close to towns which provide most of the skiing population. This eliminates the hour long drive necessary to reach many ski resorts and to get home at night.

The Harrison Park Hill, right in Owen Sound, is within walking distance for thousands of people and many of these are skiers. The weekends make of high school students make the walk along 2nd ave. e. and the park road. The tow is operated by the city as a free service to skiers — the only free lift in the region.

A report issued today by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics shows 99,914,720 admissions to Canadian movie houses in 1965, cost \$85,162,234. But in 1964 there were 107,727,728 admissions for \$78,347,715.

The 1965 study showed there were 1,418 movie theaters in the country, 347 of them drive-in, continued to 1,421 the previous year when 242 were drive-ins.
