They will sit astride round plastic discs at the end of spring feet will be touching the ground at all times. The new two is 1300 feet

The new tow is 1,300 feet long, and takes skiers up 400 vertical feet. From this height they can choose the main ski run which runs for

half a mile, or the short and very steep ski run, which is some 2,200 feet long, and is designed for expert skiers.
