

## Good Skiing Conditions In Wisconsin

Excellent weekend skiing conditions in most sections of the state were forecast today by the federal weather bureau at Milwaukee.

Winter sports fans were assured of enough snow in most areas for skiing, with ice fishing, tobogganing, snow shoeing, and skating described as good in most state winter sport centers.

Weatherman Howard Thompson warned, however, that dropping temperatures would necessitate added precautions on the part of more hardy followers of winter recreation.

Here are some of the station conditions at various Wisconsin sport centers:

**Holy Hill**— Average snow depth three inches. One inch of fluffy snow on a hard base. Ski tow open Saturday and Sunday.

**Tower Hill, Lannon**— Upper and lower trails excellent. Ski tow open Saturday afternoon and Sunday.

**Cedar Lake, Fox Hill**— Upper and lower trails fair. Ski tow will operate Saturday afternoon and Sunday. Eight inches of snow.

**Slinger Hill**— Upper and lower trails excellent. Average snow depth eight inches. Three to four inches new powdery snow. Skiing excellent. Ski tow will operate Saturday and Sunday.

**Rib Hill, Wausau**— Upper and lower trails excellent. 18 inches powdered snow over 12 inch packed base. Excellent skiing conditions on all trails and open slopes. Tobogganing, skating, ice fishing all excellent. Two new Underwood tows operating daily.

**Sturgeon Bay**— Upper and lower trails good. Three to six inches average snow depth. Three inches of powdery surface snow. Skiing, fair, tobogganing excellent. Tow line operating.

**Beloit Rockford**— Average snow depth three inches.

**Green Bay**— Upper and lower trails excellent. Three to six inches average snow. Four inches powdery surface snow. Skiing and tobogganing excellent.

**Land O'Lakes**— Upper and lower trails excellent. 32 inches of snow on ground. Three inches powdery surface snow. Skiing, tobogganing and skating excellent.
