

## 21 Snow Sport Areas Ready in Wisconsin

Because of an expected record number of winter vacationists, Wisconsin's 21 winter sports areas are making special preparations for the entertainment of sports enthusiasts this season. Numerous regular winter vacation centers have added new facilities, and a number of new areas have been developed, in order to accommodate the increasing number of persons who come to ski, skate, snowshoe, sleigh, toboggan, or go ice boating in Wisconsin's winter wonderland.

The winter sportsman will find accommodations ranging from comfortable hotels, to northwoods cabins, to cozy farms, but it is recommended that he make reservations in advance, in order to insure accommodations in the area of his choice. He will find an average snowfall varying from 30 inches in the south to 115 inches in the north, with good railroad, bus, and airline service to the popular sport spots.

Among southeastern Wisconsin's important centers of activity are Devil's Lake at Baraboo, with ski runs up to 1,200 feet, and skating; Scuppernong Area at North Prairie, 12 miles southwest of Waukesha, with slope skiing 100 feet long, and a 500 foot rope tow; Holy Hill, six miles west of Richfield, 25 miles northwest of Milwaukee, with slope skiing served by rope tow; Wilnot Hills, 20 miles west of Kenosha, with 200 foot hills, and four rope tows; Fox Hill, seven miles southwest of West Bend on Cedar Lake, with runs and slopes 750 feet, and 750 foot rope tow.

Also Pleasure Valley in the heart of Blue Mounds, 26 miles west of Madison, with two ski jumps, slalom run, rope tows 300 and 600 feet, ice skating day and night; tobogganing, track for skijoring, and 250 foot hills; Snow Bowl at La Crosse, with 400 foot hill, rope tows of 600 and 1,000 feet, 1,000

foot ski runs; lighted slopes, ski touring, and skating; Holiday Hill at Lake Geneva, with 200 foot hill, two 800 foot rope tows, 1,000 foot ski runs, and ski touring; New Munster Hills, 20 miles west of Kenosha, with 200 foot hill; two 500 foot rope tows, 50 foot and 80 foot jumps, and a 500 foot run toboggan; Slinger Hill, 10 miles west of West Bend, with 200 foot hill, 600 foot rope tow, 600 foot ski run, and skating in Slinger; Potawatomi State Park at Sturgeon Bay, with 130 foot hill, 400-600 foot runs; 500 foot ski tow, two steel toboggan chutes, 1,000 foot runs, toboggan runs, toboggan tow, beginners' ski slope, 15 and 25 meter ski jumps, cross-country trails, observation tower, ice fishing, and downtown skating rink; and Bay View Ski Hill at Williams

Bay, with 100 foot hill, 500 foot rope tow, 1,000 foot ski runs, and ice boats.

Northern Wisconsin's centers are located at Moon Valley at Green Bay, with runs and slopes

from 200 to 600 feet, and 200 and 400 foot rope tows; Land O' Lakes in extreme northern Wisconsin, with 100 and 200 foot hills, three 600 foot rope tows, ski runs up to 1,300 feet, ski trails to 5 miles, 600 foot toboggan run, skating, cutters, sleighs, and snowshoeing; Boulder Junction, with ski runs up to 500 feet, 600 foot toboggan run; and skating; Hazelhurst, with 200 foot hills; 500 foot rope tow, 600 foot ski runs, 600 foot toboggan run, skating, and ice boats; Mount Telemark at Hayward-Cable, with downhill trails up to 2,600 feet, vertical drops of 350 feet, three rope tows, and ski school.

Also Rib Mountain at Wausau, with 600 foot elevation, two rope tows totaling 2,700 feet, 7 trails, and open slope 400 feet wide and 2,600 feet long; Phelps, with ski runs to 600 feet, and ski touring to 6 miles; Three Lakes, with ski hill 110 feet, 400 foot rope tow, 600 foot ski runs, skating rink, sleigh rides, and ski-joring; Mont Du Lac at Superior, three 1,300 foot downhill trails with vertical descents of 250 feet, and ski school.
