

State Offers 48 Slopes

Winter is for skiing and Wisconsin has much winter no it follows that skiing has been in Wisconsin a long, long time.

With 48 ski hills in the state, no skier should be without a place to try his favorite sport. In all areas of the state, whether towns, villages or cities, skiing equipment and clothes are to be found. Resorts welcome skiers throughout the season, and most ski hills provide for the appetite that comes with swooshing down a slope.

Many have facilities for after-ski entertainment and a variety of winter sports. The following list is offered to assist in finding the ski area that best suits your needs.

Alpine Valley, three miles south, one mile west of East Troy on Highway D. Four chair lifts, six rope runs; 13 runs, longest run 3,000 feet, best vertical drop 200 feet, trails, snow machine, patrol rentals, lighted refreshments, instruction.

Eight Rope Tows

Majestic Hills, seven miles southwest of Lake Geneva on South Shore Drive. Ski shop, lounge, eight rope tows, five runs, longest run 1,000 feet, best vertical drop 200 feet. All above facilities except trails.

Mt. Fuji Four Seasons, two miles northeast of Lake Geneva on highway 36. Eight rope tows, one T-bar, 12 runs, longest run 2,000 feet, best vertical drop 200 feet. All facilities.

North Hills, 1 1/2 miles north of Ft. Atkinson on highway K. One rope tow, five runs, longest run 1,200 feet, best vertical drop 175 feet. Trails and patrol only.

Norway Basin, 20 miles west of Madison on highway 1E. Three rope tows, one chair lift, one T-bar, six runs, longest run 2,000 feet, best vertical drop 300 feet. All facilities except lights.

Spring Valley Winter Park, four miles southwest of Burlington via highway 38. Three rope tows, 15 runs, longest run 1,200 feet, best vertical drop 100 feet. All facilities.

Wilnot Hills, one mile south of Wilnot on highway W. Two chair lifts, two T-bars, 12 rope tows, 30 runs, longest run 2,500 feet, best vertical drop 230 feet. All facilities except trails.

Fox Hill, five miles north of

Slingshot on highway NN. Three runs, six runs, longest run 1,200 feet, best vertical drop 225 feet. Trails, patrol and instruction.

Greenbush, three miles south of Greenbush on highway 67 in Kettle Moraine Forest. One tow, three runs, longest run 700 feet, best vertical drop 100 feet. Trails and patrol.

Hidden Valley, 15 miles north of Manitowoc on highway 141. Ski shop, beer, stove, five runs, longest run 2,000 feet, best vertical drop 200 feet. Trails, snow machine, patrol, rentals, lighted refreshments, instruction.

Near Milwaukee

Little Switzerland, 25 miles northwest of Milwaukee on highway 41. Ski jump, eight rope tows, two chair lifts, ten runs, longest run 2,000 feet, best vertical drop 200 feet. All above facilities.

Mary Hill, 1/4 mile west of Sunser on Mary Hill road, south of Friendship on highway 14. Three rope tows, eight runs, longest run 2,000 feet, best vertical drop 200 feet. Trails, patrol, lighted refreshments.

Powderhorn, six miles south of Hartford, 1/4 mile east of highway 83 on highway Q. One tow, three runs, longest run 1,000 feet, best vertical drop 100 feet. Trails, patrol, lighted refreshments.

Ultr, seven miles southwest of Plymouth on highway 5 and U. Two tows, five runs, longest run 1,200 feet, best vertical drop 140 feet. Patrol, lighted.

2,000-Foot Run

Wanderberg, four miles north of West Bend on highway 65. Three rope tows, one T-bar, six runs, 3,000 feet longest run, best vertical drop 300 feet. All above facilities.

Noe-Ski Ridge, one mile south of Fis Creek on highway 62. Ski shop, three rope tows, one T-bar, seven runs, longest run 3,500 feet, best vertical drop 225 feet. All facilities.

Potawatomi, six miles west of Sturgeon Bay on highway C. Ice fishing, tobogganing, two rope tows, four runs, longest run 800 feet, best vertical drop 150 feet. No snow machine, no rentals.

Cabernet Park, 15 miles east of Appleton on highway 55. Free lessons, ice fishing, four rope tows, four runs, longest run 1,200 feet, best vertical drop 100 feet. No snow machine.

View Ridge, two miles east of New London on highway 5 off highway 65. Four tows, four runs, longest run 2,400 feet, best vertical drop 100 feet. No snow machine.

Ice Skating

Birch Haven, eight miles north of Sauk City on highway C. Ice skating, three tows, three runs, longest run 1,800 feet, best vertical drop 275 feet. No snow machine.

Cascade Mountain, four miles west of Portage on interstate 90 and 94. Double chair lift, ski shop, cocktail lounge, one chair lift, six rope tows, 12 runs, longest run 5,200 feet, best vertical drop 400 feet. All facilities.

Freddie Valley, two miles south of Berlin off highway 49. One tow, four runs, longest run 1,300 feet, best vertical drop 150 feet. No trails, no snow machine.

Sky Line, 1/2 mile north of Friendship on highway 13. Five rope tows, three runs, longest run 1,200 feet, best vertical drop 350 feet. All facilities.

Woodside Ranch, five miles east of Mauston on highway 82. All winter sports, two tows, two runs, longest run 1,000 feet, best vertical drop 150 feet. No snow machine.

Mineral Point Ski Slope, four miles southwest of Mineral Point on county highway Q. One rope tow, two runs, longest run 1,000 feet, best vertical drop 40 feet. Lighted.

Mt. LaCrosse, six miles south of LaCrosse on highway 35. Four T-bars, one Pomalift, ten runs, longest run 5,500 feet, best vertical drop 516 feet. All facilities.

Brace Mountain, 15 miles southwest of Neillville on highway 95. All winter sports, toboggan run, five rope tows, six runs, longest run 2,000 feet, best vertical drop 300 feet. All facilities.

Powers Bluff, 2 1/2 miles southwest of Arpin on highway NE. Toboggan run, two tows, four runs, longest run 1,750 feet, best vertical drop 250 feet. No trails, no snow machine.

Rib Mountain, three miles southwest of Wausau on highway NN. All winter sports, four rope tows, two T-bars, eight runs, longest run 3,350 feet, best vertical drop 400 feet. All facilities.

Deepwood, nine miles northwest of Colfax on highway N. Ski shop, eight rope tows, one T-bar, 16 runs, longest run 2,800 feet, best vertical drop 250 feet. All facilities.

Eaglewood, seven miles north of Somerset on highway 365. Six rope tows, two T-bars, 11 runs, longest run 3,700 feet, best vertical drop 340 feet. Patrol, rentals, refreshments, instruction.

Hardscrabble, five miles East of Rice Lake on highway C. All winter sports, eight tows, ten runs, longest run 2,600 feet. No snow machine.

Near Spooner

Lockhaven, 2 1/2 miles south-east of Spooner on highway 63-52. Ski shop, five rope tows, five runs, longest run 2,000 feet, best vertical drop 250 feet. All facilities.

December 6, 1970 Sunday Post-Crescent 17

Mont de Lac, 15 miles southwest of Duluth on highway 35. One T-bar, three rope tows, eight runs, longest run 2,400 feet, best vertical drop 310 feet. All facilities.

Mt. Ashwabay, 2 miles north of Bayfield on highway 13. All winter sports, lodging at Bayfield Inn. One T-bar, five rope tows, eight runs, longest run 2,800 feet, best vertical drop 317 feet. No snow machine.

Mt. Telemark, four miles east of Cable on highway 63. Ski shop, cocktail lounge, three T-bars, ten rope tows, ten runs, longest run 2,000 feet, best vertical drop 370 feet. Not lighted.

Ski-Mae, four miles south of Somerset on highway 64 or 35. Six rope tows, nine runs, longest run 2,600 feet, best vertical drop 240 feet. No trails.

Longest Run

Trollhaugen, 1/2 mile east of Dresser. Ski shop, three T-bars, ten rope tows, ten runs, longest run 3,000 feet, best vertical drop 380 feet. No rentals.

Camp 18, ten miles south of Rhinelander on highway 17. Skating, ski shop, T-bar, three runs, longest run 1,900 feet, best vertical drop 200 feet. No snow machine, not lighted.

Squirrel Hill, 12 miles southwest of Minocqua on highway 70. All winter sports, four tows, one Pomalift, 11 runs, longest run 2,000 feet, best vertical drop 200 feet. No snow machine, not lighted.

White Cap Mountain, 11 miles west of Hurley on highway 77. Ski shop, cocktail lounge and sun deck, two T-bars, two rope tows, one chair lift, seven runs, longest run 5,000 feet, best vertical drop 350 feet. Trails, patrol, rentals, refreshments, instruction.
