

Civilian Defense Ski Corps Formed In The Kettle Moraine

A number of skiers from Sheboygan, Fond du Lac, Green Bay, Neenah, Milwaukee and vicinity recently formed the first Wisconsin Civilian Defense Ski Corps for the purpose of promoting better health, to increase body endurance and to promote physical fitness, the main weapon for our defense.

The corps is endorsed by the State and County Civilian Defense Councils and the Sheboygan and Fond du Lac Associations of Commerce.

There are no financial obligations, and everyone is welcome to join and receive free instruction by expert skiers. The beautiful Forest Lake Ski Bowl in the Kettle Moraine forest will be used for all skiing purposes each Saturday and Sunday.

Erik A. Lindgren, Swedish and Finnish army instructor from abroad and also with Camp McCoy and Camp Custer last winter with the U. S. army will instruct members of the Wisconsin Civilian Defense corps. Mr. Lindgren is president of the North American Ski Scouts, and members of that organization will also lend a hand in teaching members the art of skiing.

According to the program in mind preference to grammar, high school, and college students will be given for Saturday instructions so as to leave the Sundays free to men and women of offices, shops, homes and professional work.

The Forest Lake Ski Bowl is located on state-owned land leased by William A. Kuert, proprietor of the Forest Lake Hotel and Cottages, and M. Kuert has gladly turned over this property each week-end in order to promote the First Wisconsin Civilian Defense Ski corps.

There is skiing, skating and tobogganing at the Ski Bowl; open slopes, wooded hills and ski trails; two ski tows, one of 700 feet and the other 1,000 feet, both electrically operated and floodlighted.

Skis and poles may be rented at the Forest Lake hotel at the Ski Bowl, and an instructor will be present at all times.

The Bowl is located five miles east of the junction of Highways 45, 55 and 67; take Highway 55 to Ski Bowl. The post office address is Campbellsport, Wis., and the telephone Kewaskum 75-F-13.
