

## Quit-Qui-Oc Building New Ski-Tow Hill

A welcome—and possibly outstanding—addition to Sheboygan county's sports facilities is in the making at Elkhart Lake these days: a new ski hill. It will be ready within two weeks.

The hill is being prepared at Quit-Qui-Oc golf course at the extreme south end of the property actually beyond the new second nine layout. The top of the hill can be reached by a new gravel road heading west off the gravel road paralleling Highway 67 and dividing the first and second nines of the course. Its crest is the old 12th tee of the original Quit-Qui-Oc links.

Pro Carl Wiese indicated that there has been considerable interest in the project from community resorts and that if the first season's attendance is good enough, a T-bar lift and other improvements may be installed in the future. For the present, a rope tow and warming house will suffice.

With a rare north exposure which avoids icy packing and which also prolongs skiing conditions, the new hill could be an excellent one. It has a surprising 220-foot verticle height and has several varied runs ranging from a short distance of 2,000 feet to a longer, winding slope of 3,000 feet. The slopes have a good range of incline as well as distance.

Tow posts and the engine will be installed next week, Wiese said.
